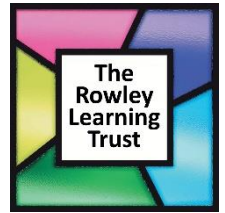

Old Hill Primary School is a place of excellence where children can achieve full potential in their academic, creative, personal, physical, social, moral spiritual and cultural development.

Our Home School Agreement sets out the partnership between the school and family to benefit the educational development of each child.

The Governors ask that all parents/carers who accept a place at the school sign the document to show that they understand and accept the values of the school. The agreement will be sent out with other information before a child starts at the school.

The school is committed to working with parents through an atmosphere of mutual trust and respect. As partners in the education of children, we will achieve this by the following:

The school will:

- Ensure that a high quality education with a broad balanced curriculum is provided so that all children become resilient learners, achieve highly and fulfil their potential.
- Promote an atmosphere where all children and adults are treated equally and have respect for themselves and each other.
- Promote a culture where children take pride in what they do and be inspired for life.
- Foster an ethos in which children learn in a happy and safe school.
- Work to create a strong and effective partnership between school, family and our local community.
- Help children develop into healthy citizens who are equipped to participate fully and responsibly in a 21st century world.

The family will:

- Ensure that children come to school every day, on time, wearing the appropriate school uniform and be ready to learn.
- Work in partnership with the school to build on and extend children's learning.
- Promote good behaviour and high expectations by modelling courtesy and respect at all times.
- Work in partnership with the school so that children have the skills to keep themselves safe at all times.
- Be committed to working effectively with the school and supporting and promoting its values.
- Support all school efforts to ensure that children develop as healthy citizens, able to participate fully and responsibly.

In addition to supporting the aims of the school, parents/carers also agree to:

- Inform the school in writing if you do not consent for your child's photograph/video to be published in exercise book, on the school website, twitter, school app, school displays and local media.
- Support all school policies including uniform, attendance, behaviour and homework.
- Not take holidays in term time, in line with Government guidelines revised 1st September 2014.
- Show commitment to your child's education by attending open evenings, assemblies, meetings and other school events.
- Ensure that the school's admission information is kept up to date – for example emergency telephone numbers, medical information, change of address etc.
- Provide two named contacts (over 16) who may collect your child – and telephone the school beforehand in the event of an emergency where adults who are not named contacts will be collecting children – please note: we do not allow anyone under 16 years of age to collect children.
- Ensure that your child arrives at school promptly for 8.55am (school gates open at 8.45am) and is collected promptly at 3.15pm. Children who frequently arrive late for school and/or are collected late on repeated occasions will be referred to the Attendance and Prosecution Team and/or Social Services. Also in any instance of late collection after 4.15pm where no contact has been made with the school. These procedures are in line with the Attendance Policy.

Please note: We upload photographs of events for the media, twitter and the school website we also allow parents and family members to use cameras and videos at all school productions and assemblies. If you wish your child to be omitted from these events please contact the school in writing. Parents are requested not to publish videos or photographs of school events that may contain other children, on social media such as facebook etc.
